Big Rock Primary School Police Vetting Procedures and Guidelines

Rationale:

The Vulnerable Children Act 2014 states that all children's workers must be police vetted as part of a safety check. A children's worker is anyone whose work involves regular or overnight contact with children and who undertakes this work without parents or guardians being present.

At Big Rock Primary School this includes parent helpers for camps and overnight trips.

Guidelines:

- Volunteers at Big Rock will be vetted if they are in a situation where they will be left alone with children for more than thirty minutes and parents who wish to attend camps or overnight stays
- The school will ensure the strictest confidentiality
- The only staff members who will read the police vet are the Principal and Deputy Principal
- The principal will ensure that the subject of the police vet receives a copy of their
 police vet and ask the subject to validate anything in the resulting vet that is
 adverse. The subject must be given a reasonable amount of time to validate the
 information before the principal can take adverse action.

Volunteers

- Volunteers will be vetted if they are in a situation that requires them to be left alone with children for more than thirty minutes
- Parents staying overnight on school trips or camps will be police vetted
- If the vetting is not satisfactory the Principal will inform the parent and discuss that person's options: either to provide proof that the information is wrong or to withdraw from the camp
- If the parent satisfies the Principal that the information is incorrect and the original vetting form is amended, the parent will be informed that they can attend camp.

Returned Result after Police Vetting

In the case of a returned result for the following offences *or* if the Principal believes it to be significant then the following table will be followed.

Type of Offence	Vetting Outcome
Any offence of a sexual nature	Subject unable to attend camp
Any offence that involves children	Subject unable to attend camp
Any offence where the subject served a	Subject unable to attend camp
custodial sentence within the last 5 years	
Any offence involving violence	Subject unable to attend camp
Driving offences (Non-custodial)	Able to attend but not drive

All other offences will be taken into consideration as well as time elapsed.
